Dear Mr. Salard:

Thank you for taking the time to meet me on September 6, 2018 to inspect Dubois Road and to hear our concern. Based on our site visit, RoyOMartin requests that a portion of Dubois Road be taken out of the parish road system. Dubois Rd begins at the intersection with Bay Springs Road. We propose that after a length of 1.0 miles from the intersection of Bay Springs Road, the remainder of Dubois Road be taken out of the parish road system. This point of abandonment corresponds with the RoyOMartin property line. Please see enclosed map. From this point in the road, there are severe washouts that are very dangerous. We intend to repair these washouts upon gaining ownership of the road. We will continue to provide access to any of the other landowners that utilize this road. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns about the matter.

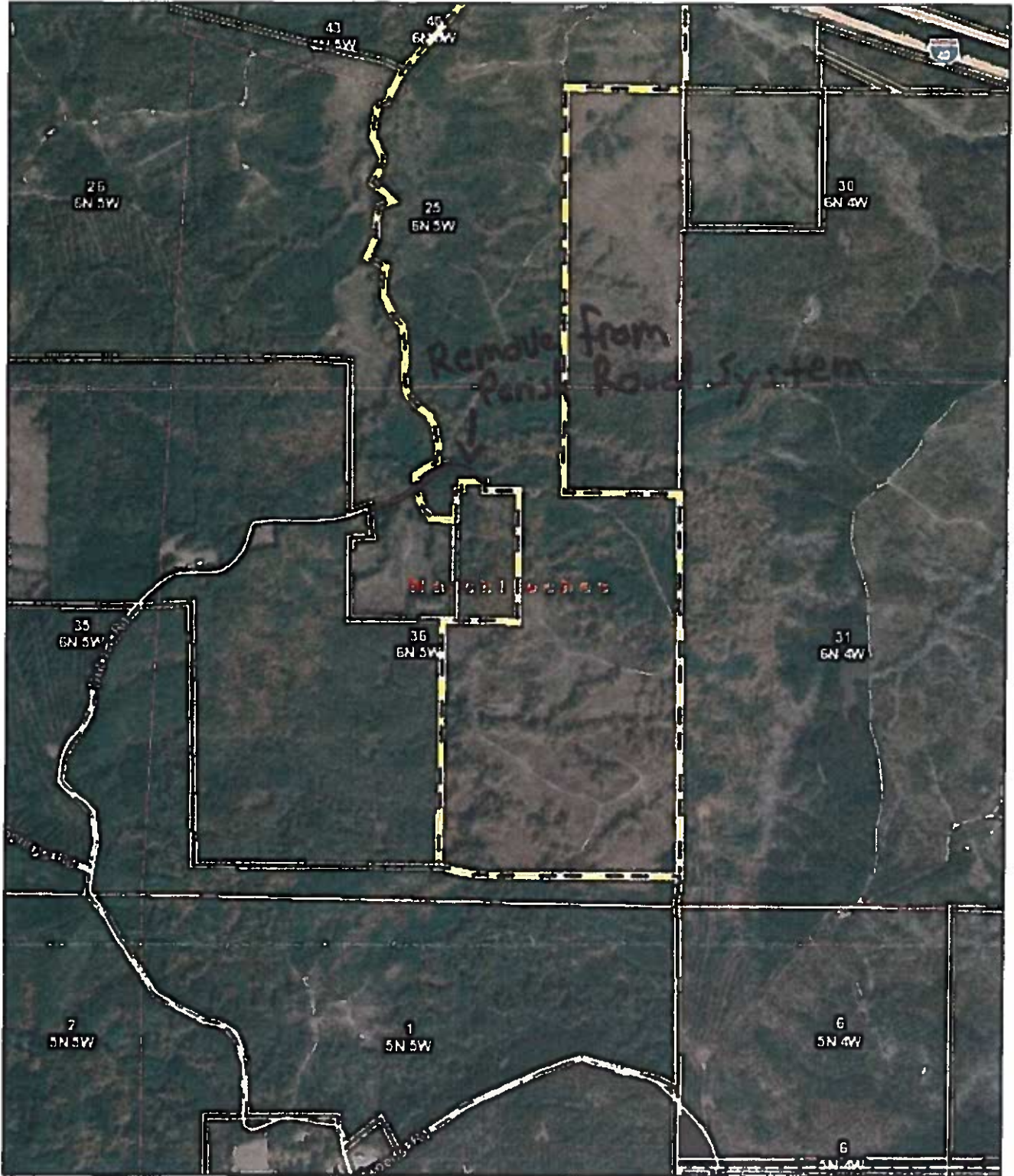

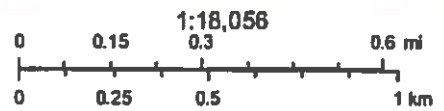

SECTION 3. Pursuant to the Act, the governing authority of the District shall be the Parish Council, as it is the governing authority of the Parish and the District is composed of territory wholly within the Parish, and the members of the Parish Council shall be the officers of the District serving as such without extra compensation.

SECTION 4. The domicile of the District shall be the same as that of the Parish; the District shall have prepared a seal with the word "SEAL" on the inside and surrounded by the official name of the District, which seal is hereby adopted as the official seal of the District; the official journal of the Parish from time-to-time shall be the initial official journal of the District; the Clerk of the Parish Council shall serve as Clerk of governing authority of the District; the fiscal agent bank of the Parish shall be the initial fiscal bank of the District until the District is able to name its own fiscal agent bank; and the fiscal year of the District shall be the same as that of the Parish.

SECTION 5. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 6. If any provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance, but this Ordinance shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had not been contained herein. SECTION 2. In accordance with the Act, the District shall constitute a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, with all the rights, powers and privileges granted by the Act and other constitutional and statutory authority to public corporations and political subdivisions of the State of Louisiana, including the authority to incur debt and to issue bonds, subject to any and all limitations set forth in the Act.

SECTION 3. Pursuant to the Act, the governing authority of the District shall be the Parish Council, as it is the governing authority of the Parish and the District is composed of territory wholly within the Parish, and the members of the Parish Council shall be the officers of the District serving as such without extra compensation.

SECTION 4. ORDINANCE NO.

An ordinance creating Road District No. 4 of the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana; and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, pursuant to and in compliance with the provisions of Part II, Chapter 2, Title 48 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, the Parish Council of the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana (the "Parish Council"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), adopted a resolution on June 18, 2018, declaring the intention of the Parish Council to create Road District No. 4 of the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana (the "District"), describing the territory to compose the district and the proposed boundaries thereof, ordering and directing the publication of a notice of intention to create said district, and providing for the hearing of any and all objections to the creation thereof; and

WHEREAS, notice of intention of the Parish Council to create the District was published 4 times pursuant to the Act in the *Natchitoches Times*, the official journal of the Parish, said publications occurring on June 21, June 28, July 5 and July 12, 2018.

WHEREAS, pursuant to and in compliance with the provisions of the Act, the Parish Council has, on this date, heard and addressed any and all objections to the creation of the District; and

WHEREAS, the Parish Council now desires to adopt an ordinance creating and fixing the boundaries of the District pursuant to the Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Parish Council that:

SECTION 1. In accordance with the provisions of Part II, Chapter 2, Title 48 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, there is hereby created Road District No. 4 of the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana, which District shall comprise and embrace all the territory

SECTION 2. In accordance with the Act, the District shall constitute a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, with all the rights, powers and privileges granted by the Act and other constitutional and statutory authority to public corporations and political subdivisions of the State of Louisiana, including the authority to incur debt and to issue bonds, subject to any and all limitations set forth in the Act.

SECTION 3. Pursuant to the Act, the governing authority of the District shall be the Parish Council, as it is the governing authority of the Parish and the District is composed of territory wholly within the Parish, and the members of the Parish Council shall be the officers of the District serving as such without extra compensation.

SECTION 4. The domicile of the District shall be the same as that of the Parish; the District shall have prepared a seal with the word "SEAL" on the inside and surrounded by the official name of the District, which seal is hereby adopted as the official seal of the District; the official journal of the Parish from time-to-time shall be the initial official journal of the District; the Clerk of the Parish Council shall serve as Clerk of governing authority of the District; the fiscal agent bank of the Parish shall be the initial fiscal bank of the District until the District is able to name its own fiscal agent bank; and the fiscal year of the District shall be the same as that of the Parish.

SECTION 5. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 6. If any provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance, but this Ordinance shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had not been

ORDINANCE #018-2018

An Ordinance Adopting setting the franchise fee to be paid by CP-TEL providing cable or video service within the Parish's Residents outside the City of Natchitoches under a state - granted franchise authority and otherwise providing with respect thereto.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Consumer Choice for Television Act of 2008, codified at LSA-RS. 45:1361 et seq, any person or entity desiring to provide cable or video services within the Parish of Natchitoches may do so by obtaining a state-issued certificate of franchise authority;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of LSA-R.S. 45:1366, the holder of a state-issued certificate of franchise authority for cable or video service is required to pay a franchise fee to the Parish in which it operates upon the passage of an ordinance by Parish setting such a fee; and

WHEREAS, there are persons or entities which operate or desire to operate cable or video services to Parish residents outside the City of Natchitoches.

BE IT THEREFORE ordained by the Parish Government of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana, that all persons or entities providing cable or video services to the citizens residing in the unincorporated limits of the Parish of Natchitoches pursuant to a state-issued certificate of franchise authority as provided in LSA-R.S. 45:1361 et seq shall, pursuant to the provisions of LSA-R.S. 45:1366, pay the Parish of Natchitoches a franchise fee equal to five percent (5%) of the cable or video service provider's gross revenues, as that term is defined by the "Consumer Choice for Television Act of 2008," derived from operations within the Parish's unincorporated limits.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all ordinances and resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, except those approving any cable or video franchise agreement in force and effect between the Parish and any cable or video service provider.

Shall Fire Protection District No. 8 of the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana (the "District"), levy and collect a special tax of thirteen and ninety-four hundredths (13.94) mills on all property subject to taxation in said District (an estimated \$29,040 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2019 and ending with the year 2028, for the purpose of constructing, acquiring, improving, maintaining and/or operating fire protection facilities and equipment in and for the District and paying the cost of obtaining water for fire protection purposes?

Dear Natchitoches Parish Council Members:

For generations, Louisianans have developed a culture and economy surrounding the wild-caught shrimp industry. We are especially proud of our shrimp harvested directly from the waters of the Gulf of Mexico; however, the industry has been in severe decline over the last decade. Over 100,000,000 pounds of shrimp are captured annually in Louisiana; however, 90% of shrimp eaten in the U.S. are imported.

The FDA is responsible for the safety of all fish and fishery products entering the United States; however, in fiscal year 2016, the FDA inspected only 144 foreign seafood processor facilities for HACCP compliance, or nearly 2% of the 7,669 total processors that exported seafood to the United States that year. That's simply not enough.

I have sent a letter to President Trump requesting that the USDA and FDA take immediate measures to significantly increase the level of seafood inspections at the harvest sites and at our borders. My request to you, as a Council, is to pass a resolution requesting that the Louisiana Congressional Delegation introduce and support legislation to impose a \$.10 cent per pound fee on all seafood imported into the United States to be utilized to improve imported seafood safety. The fees collected on imported seafood can be used to fund the hiring of additional inspectors to insure the safety of imported seafood consumed by Americans.

I would be more than happy to attend your council meeting to personally testify and support this resolution. I am committed to protecting and enhancing Louisiana's shrimp and seafood industries. Shrimp is the largest imported seafood product and imports have wreaked havoc on our domestic fisherman, dock owners, processors, and brokers. The lack of inspection creates a tangible threat to our national security and the health and safety of American citizens.

I look forward to working with you and your fellow council members to protect Americans from eating unsafe seafood. If I can ever be of assistance to you in any way, please don't hesitate to call.






NATCHITOCHE PARISH P J, hereinafter called the Holder, is hereby authorized to use, subject to the terms and conditions of this permit, National Forest System land identified within the unit area and described as Sec. 8, T. 6 N., R. 8 W., LOUISIANA MERIDIAN, Sec. 21, T. 5 N., R. 7 W., LOUISIANA MERIDIAN, Sec. 21, T. 6 N., R. 8 W., LOUISIANA MERIDIAN, Sec. 19, T. 12 N., R. 5 W., LOUISIANA MERIDIAN, , as shown on the attached Exhibit(s) See File. This authorization covers approximately .63 acres and/or 0 miles.

The holder is authorized to conduct the following activities and/ or install the following temporary improvements on the permitted area:

Keep and Maintain Solid waste garbage bins located on THE Kisatchie Ranger District of the Kisatchie National Forest.

As per original Permit and Decision Notice, dated 07/17/1981, Holder will mitigate negative impacts on aesthetics by:

- 1) Two pick-ups per week and one trip per week by parish crew to clean up site.
- 2) Chain link fence will be built around bin sites.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Use under this permit shall begin on 08/15/2018 and end on 08/01/2019. The permit shall not be extended.
2. The fee for this use is Free Use It shall be paid in advance and is not refundable.
3. The holder shall conduct the authorized activities according to the attached approved plans and specifications, Exhibit(s) See File.
4. The holder shall not install any improvements not specifically identified and approved above.
5. No soil, trees, or other vegetation may be destroyed or removed from National Forest System lands without specific prior written permission from the authorized officer.
6. The holder shall comply with all Federal, State, county, and municipal laws, ordinances, and regulations which are applicable to the area or operations covered by this permit.
7. The holder shall maintain the improvements and premises to standards of repair, orderliness, neatness, sanitation, and safety acceptable to the authorized officer. The holder shall fully repair and bear the expense for all damage, other than ordinary wear and tear, to National Forest System lands, roads and trails caused by the holder's activities.
8. The holder has the responsibility of inspecting the use area and adjoining areas for dangerous trees, hanging limbs, and other evidence of hazardous conditions which would pose a risk of injury to individuals. After securing permission from the authorized officer, the holder shall remove such hazards.
9. The holder shall be liable for any damage suffered by the United States resulting from or related to use of this permit, including damages to National Forest resources and costs of fire suppression.
10. The holder shall hold harmless the United States from any liability from damage to life or property arising from the holder's occupancy or use of National Forest lands under this permit.

11. The holder agrees to permit the free and unrestricted access to and upon the premises at all times for all lawful and proper purposes not inconsistent with the intent of the permit or with the reasonable exercise and enjoyment by the holder of the privileges thereof.
12. This permit is subject to all valid existing rights and claims outstanding in third parties.
13. This permit may be revoked upon breach of any of the conditions herein or at the discretion of the authorized officer. Upon expiration or revocation of this permit, the holder shall immediately remove all improvements except those owned by the United States, and shall restore the site within 14 day(s), unless otherwise agreed upon in writing. If the holder fails to remove the improvements, they shall become the property of the United States, but that will not relieve the holder of liability for the cost of their removal and restoration of the site.
14. This permit is a license for the use of federally owned land. It does not grant any interest in real property. This permit is not transferable. The holder shall not enter into any agreements with third parties for occupancy of the authorized premises and improvements.
15. Appeal of any provisions of this permit or any requirements thereof shall be subject to the appeal regulations at 36 CFR 214, or revisions thereof.
16. This permit is accepted subject to the conditions set forth herein, condition(s) See File and Exhibit(s) See File attached to and made a part of this permit.
17. The above clauses shall control if they conflict with additional clauses or provisions.

18. Nondiscrimination (B-1).

1. The holder and its employees shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, color, sex (in educational activities), national origin, age, or disability or by curtailing or refusing to furnish accommodations, facilities, services, or use privileges offered to the public generally. In addition, the holder and its employees shall comply with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 as amended, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended, and the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended.
2. The holder shall include and require compliance with the above nondiscrimination provisions in any third-party agreement made with respect to the operations authorized under this permit.
3. The Forest Service shall furnish signs setting forth this policy of nondiscrimination. These signs shall be conspicuously displayed at the public entrance to the premises and at other exterior or interior locations, as directed by the Forest Service.
4. The Forest Service shall have the right to enforce the foregoing nondiscrimination provisions by suit for specific performance or by any other available remedy under the laws of the United States or the State in which the violation occurs.

19. Operating Plan (C-8).

The holder shall prepare and annually revise by 01/15/2019 an operating plan. The operating plan shall be prepared in consultation with the Authorized Officer or the Authorized Officer's designated representative and shall cover all operations authorized by this permit. The operating plan shall outline steps the holder will take to protect public health and safety and the environment and shall

include sufficient detail and standards to enable the Forest Service to monitor the holder's operations for compliance with the terms and conditions of this permit. The operating plan shall identify and schedule any inspections that the holder is required to conduct at the holder's expense. The operating plan shall be submitted by the holder and approved by the Authorized Officer or the Authorized Officer's designated representative prior to commencement of operations and shall be attached to this permit as an appendix. The Authorized Officer may require an annual meeting with the holder to discuss the terms and conditions of the permit or operating plan, provide annual use reports, determine need for performance bond for construction projects and amount of bond, or other concerns either party may have.

20. Ground Surface Protection and Restoration (D-9).

The holder shall prevent and control soil erosion and gulying on National Forest System lands in and adjacent to the permit area resulting from construction, operation, maintenance, and termination of the authorized use. The holder shall construct authorized improvements so as to avoid accumulation of excessive amounts of water in the permit area and encroachment on streams. The holder shall revegetate or otherwise stabilize (for example, by constructing a retaining wall) all ground where the soil has been exposed as a result of the holder's construction, maintenance, operation, or termination of the authorized use.

21. Herbicide and Pesticide Use (D-18).

Herbicides and pesticides may not be used outside of buildings to control undesirable woody and herbaceous vegetation, aquatic plants, insects, rodents, or fish without the prior written approval of the Authorized Officer. A request for approval of planned uses of pesticides shall be submitted annually by the holder on the due date established by the Authorized Officer. The report shall cover a 12-month period of planned use beginning 3 months after the reporting date. Information essential for review shall be provided in the form specified. Exceptions to this schedule may be allowed, subject to emergency request and approval, only when unexpected outbreaks of pests require control measures which were not anticipated at the time an annual report was submitted. Only those materials registered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for the specific purpose planned shall be authorized for use on National Forest System lands. Label instructions and all applicable laws and regulations shall be strictly followed in the application of pesticides and disposal of excess materials and containers.

22. Definite Tenure (E-5).

This authorization is issued for the period ending on 08/01/2019. The authorization will not be renewed or extended.

23. Protection of Endangered, Threatened, and Sensitive Species (X-8).

The location of sites within the permit area needing special measures for protection of plants or animals listed as threatened or endangered under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) of 1973, 16 U.S.C. 531 *et seq.*, as amended, or as sensitive by the Regional Forester under Forest Service Manual (FSM) 2670, pursuant to consultation conducted under section 7 of the ESA, may be identified on the ground or shown on a separate map. The map shall be attached to this permit as an appendix. The

holder shall take any protective and mitigative measures specified by the Authorized Officer. If protective and mitigative measures prove inadequate, if other sites within the permit area containing threatened, endangered, or sensitive species are discovered, or if new species are listed as threatened or endangered under the ESA or as sensitive by the Regional Forester under the FSM, the Authorized Officer may specify additional protective and mitigative measures. Discovery of these areas by the holder or the Forest Service shall be promptly reported to the other party.

24. Archaeological-Paleontological Discoveries(X-17).

The holder shall immediately notify the Authorized Officer of all antiquities or other objects of historic or scientific interest, including but not limited to historic or prehistoric ruins, fossils, or artifacts discovered in connection with the use and occupancy authorized by this permit. The holder shall leave these discoveries intact and in place until directed otherwise by the Authorized Officer. Protective and mitigative measures specified by the Authorized Officer shall be the responsibility of the holder.

25. Damage Restoration (X-21).

Natchitoches Parish will reimburse the Forest Service for wages, salaries, travel, material, equipment use, and other expenses incurred by the Forest Service in performing work for Natchitoches Parish as provided by this authorization. Such repayment will be under the authority of section 601, Economy Act, June 30, 1932, and the expenses itemized and identified by project and will be billed quarterly by Form SF-1081, Voucher and Schedule of Withdrawals and Credits. It is understood and agreed that Forest Service reimbursements will include an amount for general expense and for general supervision of project work by members of the regular organization not paid directly from project funds. It is also understood and agreed that the Forest Service will be reimbursed for annual and sick leave earned by project employees while employed on these projects.

26. Improvement Relocation (X-33).

This authorization is granted with the express understanding that should future location of United States Government-owned improvements or road rights-of-way require the relocation of the holder's improvements, such relocation will be done by, and at the expense of, the holder within a reasonable time as specified by the Authorized Officer.

27. Performance by Holder, Successors, or Assigns (X-68).

Notwithstanding the expiration or any renewal of this authorization or its earlier relinquishment, abandonment, or other termination, the provisions of this authorization, to the extent applicable, shall continue in effect and shall be binding on the holder, successors, or assigns, until they have fully performed their respective obligations and liabilities accruing before or on account of the expiration, or prior termination, of the authorization.

COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
NATCHITOCHE PARISH GOVERNMENT
AND
LOUISIANA DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

THIS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT is made and entered into on August 15, 2018, by and between the NATCHITOCHE PARISH GOVERNMENT, hereafter referred to as Parish/Municipality, a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana represented by Rickey L. Nowlin, Parish President, and the Louisiana Department of Veterans Affairs (hereafter referred to as LDVA), a state agency within the Executive Branch of the State of Louisiana represented by its Secretary, Joey Strickland.

ARTICLE I

WHEREAS, Louisiana Revised Statutes, including but not limited to La R.S. 29:260-262, as amended and reenacted, specifically provides enabling legislation for LDVA to estimate and recover part of the operations cost of parish Veterans' Service Offices. Specifically, La. R.S. 29:260-262 provides that LDVA shall not contribute more than seventy-five percent (75%) for the operation and maintenance of such parish Veterans' Service Offices; that police juries and municipal governing authorities may make appropriations out of funds for the purpose of providing or assisting in providing for the maintenance and operation of Veterans' Service Offices established by LDVA; that police juries and municipal governing authorities shall provide office space for the operation of Veterans' Service Offices established by LDVA pursuant to law; and the cost of providing such office space shall not be considered as any payment or contribution required toward the expense of operation and maintenance of such Veterans' Service Office space.

ARTICLE II

WHEREAS, Parish/Municipality desires to support local veterans and improve their access to benefits and services by providing for both the cost to maintain and operate Veterans' Service Offices and space to house such service offices as provided by law.

ARTICLE III

WHEREAS, LDVA, whose physical office is located at 602 N. Fifth Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, 70802, and whose official mailing address is P.O. Box 94095, Capitol Station, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, 70804-9095, received funds in Fiscal Year 2018-2019 to provide such services to veterans in Parish/Municipality.

ARTICLE IV

WHEREAS both LDVA and Parish/Municipality desire to memorialize their respective fiscal, operational and maintenance obligations relative to the establishment of a Veterans' Service Office in Parish/Municipality,

NOW THEREFORE, LDVA and Parish/Municipality, each having authority to do so, agree as follows:

I. OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES.

A. Obligations of LDVA

1. LDVA shall provide information to veterans residing in or near Parish/Municipality and their dependents through various outlets including but not limited to the news media, internet, reading materials and personal consultation about benefits to which they are entitled, including medical services, compensation, pension programs, education, home loans, employment, benefits of patients in a nursing home, insurance benefits, referrals to housing and mental health providers and last interment benefits.
2. LDVA shall provide a highly-trained Veterans Assistance Counselor at said service office.
3. LDVA shall make every reasonable effort to ensure that the Parish Veterans' Service Office is staffed three (3) day(s) per week on the following day(s), to wit: Monday, Thursday, and Friday; excluding applicable holidays, training periods, inclement weather closures, etc.
4. LDVA will notify Parish/Municipality of closures as soon as the determination to close the office is made.
5. LDVA shall designate a contract monitor to ensure that the parties meet their obligations described herein and identify said person, along with their mailing address, email address and phone number to Parish/Municipality.

B. Obligations of Parish/Municipality

1. Parish/Municipality shall provide office space for the Veterans' Service Office that offers a safe location for LDVA employees and clients, space for private client interviews, secure storage of client files, and accessibility for disabled visitors. Said space shall be located at the following address:

1016 Keyser Avenue, Natchitoches, LA 71457

2. Parish/Municipality shall provide for all utilities, as well as 34.73% of phone and Internet service costs, as part of its obligation to provide space for the Veterans' Service Office.
3. Parish/Municipality shall provide funding to LDVA in the amount described herein to support the cost to operate and maintain the Veterans' Service Office.

II. FUNDING AND REPORTING

A. Compensation and Disbursement

1. Parish/Municipality shall contribute to the support of the Veterans' Service Office for the term defined in Paragraph III of Article IV in this Agreement by paying LDVA a total of \$3,603.01 in minimum monthly payments of \$300.25.
2. Parish/Municipality shall make payments by check or electronic means only, payable to LDVA. Prior to making the first payment, Parish/Municipality shall select its preferred method and communicate the choice to LDVA as provided in Paragraph IX of Article IV in this Agreement.

B. Invoicing

1. LDVA shall submit to Parish/Municipality an invoice for the minimum payment described herein no later than the 15th of each month.
2. Parish/Municipality shall remit payment to LDVA no later than 30 days after receipt of this invoice.

C. Reporting

1. LDVA shall provide Parish/Municipality a quarterly operations report on the number of veteran contacts and claims processed that period.
2. LDVA shall also include within that quarterly report any additional information that might assist in communicating and demonstrating the positive impact to the community of the services provided by LDVA.

III. TERM

- A. This Cooperative Endeavor Agreement shall be in effect from January 1, 2019, to December 31, 2019.

IV. TERMINATION

- A. Parish/Municipality may terminate this Agreement at any time during the term of the Agreement by giving the Contractor written notice of its intention to terminate at least thirty (30) days before the intended date of termination. The

Parish/Municipality must provide the reason for termination and reason why it cannot comply with the Louisiana Revised Statutes referenced above. Upon termination by the Parish/Municipality or the failure of Parish/Municipality to meet its obligations defined herein, LDVA may close the Veterans' Service Office operated in Parish/Municipality.

V. CONTROLLING LAW

- A. The validity, interpretation, and performance of this Agreement shall be controlled by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana.

VI. LEGAL COMPLIANCE

- A. LDVA and Parish/Municipality shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and regulations, including, specifically, but without limitation, the Louisiana Code of Governmental Ethics (R.S. 42:1101, *et seq.*), in carrying out the provisions of this Agreement.

VII. PUBLIC LIABILITY/INDEMNIFICATION

- A. Each party shall indemnify and save harmless the other party, its officers, agents, employees, contractors and assigns against any and all claims, losses, liabilities, demands, suits, causes of action, damages, and judgments of any sums of money to any party accruing against the other party, its officers, agents, employees, contractors and assigns, growing out of, resulting from, or by reason of any act or omission of the indemnifying party, its officers, or employees while engaged in, upon or about, or in connection with the discharge or performance of the terms of this Agreement or the operation, maintenance and use of the Veterans' Service Office.
- B. Nothing herein is intended, nor shall be deemed to create a third-party beneficiary to or for any obligation by any party hereto or to authorize any third person to have any action against any party hereto arising out of this Agreement.

VIII. SEVERABILITY

- A. If any term, covenant, condition, or provisions of this Agreement or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall, at any time or to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, or the application of such term, covenant, condition or provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby, and each term, covenant, condition, and provision of this Agreement shall be valid and be enforced to the fullest extent of the law.
